4. Introduction-Lighting the lamps of development

Bijapur is a drought prone region of Karnataka. Monsoon and rain determine the conditions of life of rural communities who depend on land and agriculture for their livelihood. When minimal livelihood assurance is absent, developmental needs are not met. The quality of life of people in the community is drastically affected. Lack of productivity leads to deprivation of basic needs of the members in community. Lack of resources eliminates opportunities for development. Deprivation of basic needs and wants eliminates the much needed participation of people in their development. The manifestation of deprivation is transferred from one to the other on a hierarchical form. Those at the receiving end are women and children *Vishala* came into being in 1989 to address the deprivation of women and children led to two key learnings in *Vishala*

- Goal -as, 'Helping the rural poor for sustainable livelihood leading to empowerment'.
- Vision, 'inspiring people and strengthening of marginalized communities by building their capacity'
- Values-Hope, Respect, Commitment, Accountability, Transparency

Developmental Interventions of Vishala

* Vishal adopted a 5 point intervention strategy for community development

- 1. Membership for people in community based organizations (CBOs)
- 2. Accessing of welfare, services and development from the State as constitutional right and citizenship entitlement
- 3. 'Self -help' promotion
- 4. Building 'means of production'
- 5. Productivity based development

5. Development Programs / Projects

A. CCA NABARAD Project

1. Capacity Building &Institutional Strengthening measures









Impact of the activity

- 6 trainings were conducted in conversation with KVK, Animal husbandry & Fishery Dept. Total -222 farmers & women's participated. Training content was Soil Sample Testing, Deep Ploughing, Tank Silt Application, Training on Organic Farming, CCA Training, Training for CBO's SHG/JLG/PO, & NRM.
- Exposure visit were made to attend Drought National workshop on Drought analysis &planning,KrishameleBijapur&Dharwad, Kanneri Math Kolhapur, Mama Peda ,PKPS, organic farming technics. The theme of the visit study FPO, Coopertive,IFS Practices, Entrepreneurial & Marketing skills. Total 90 farmers participated.

2. Soil and water conservation measures



Impact of the activity:

Drip irrigation is the targeted application of water directly to the root zone, fertilizer, and chemicals that when used properly can provide great benefits such as:

- * increased revenue from increased yields (up to 80%), increased quality, decreased water, labour, energy , fertilizer , pesticides cost & improved environmental quality.
- * Drip irrigation activity was taken by 15 farmers in 5.8ha
- * Horticulture plants like a Lemon, guava, anjor, custard apple, Jamun, Sapota, promoted.





3. Plantation of fuel /fodder trees & Tree siding





Impact of the activity:

- * planation of 1500 plants given to 100 farmers on bunding which can b used as fodder & fuel it has preserved & promoted pasture lands & upgrading there productivity could be an important climate proofing tool.
- * Subabul ,Simetangadi, Rain Tree, Subabul, Stylohemata, Diancha, Glyricidia seeds were given 55 farmers so sow on the bunds which helpful for as a fodder animal & fuel for human beings.

4. Soil improvement & productivity enhancement measures Impact of the activity:

- Breaking of hard crusted upper layer of the soil and deep ploughing the infiltration capacity and permeability of the soil increases which increases
- Summer ploughing improves soil structure due to alternate drying and cooling.
- Hazards of incepts & pests on subsequent crops are reduced
- summer ploughing & crop rotation are important methods to control nematicides
- Window erosion of nutritive soil articles is restricted
- 95 farmers taken this activity in 95 Ha





5. Sustainable NRM and CCA Farming Practices including Livelihood and food security activities







Impact of the activity

- Vegetables are the only source to increase not only the nutritive values of foods but also its palatability.
- Variability in rainfall and intense rain in short duration leaves the top soil eroded. As a result, soil organic matter content goes down and imbalance in soil nutrient affects crop production and productivity.
- Managing organic matter content in the soil through application of vermin-compost and/or biofertilizers at a frequent interval. Vermin-compost contains adequate quantities of N, P, K and several micronutrients essential for plant growth which will maintain the soil health

Impact of the activity

- To protect sphered community as a demo 10 families supported with wire mesh to protect 25-30 animal.
- Animal Husbandry Sector plays a major role in alleviating protein deficiency and sustainability of rural economy.
- Rural Poultry is a good occupation for the rural masses for economic sustainability and nutritional security.
- 25 families supported with 28 (giriraaj birds) per families. Fencing was contributed by individuals
